You have been selected by the sponsoring Toastmasters club, Live Learn Lead, to participate in the program.

The Youth Leadership Program is a workshop consisting of **eight two-hour sessions** that enable you to develop communication and leadership skills through practical experience.

To get the most of the program, you should attend each of the eight sessions. In order to graduate, you must attend at least 5 of the 8 sessions. Upon completion of the program, your family, friends and school principals are invited to your graduation ceremony on <u>August 28, 2021.</u>



How it Works:

The sponsoring Toastmasters Club has provided a coordinator to present the program.

The coordinator attends each meeting, where he or she will lead most of the presentations and support the Youth Leadership Officers. Assistant Coordinator(s) and Guest Toastmasters will attend to support various components of the program as well.

Meetings generally follow a format similar to that of a Toastmasters club meeting,

This includes an announced agenda, practice in parliamentary procedure, selection of presiding officers, introducing a word of the day, table topics and prepared speeches.

- 5) Listen with open ears and an open mind! Try to catch as much as you can about your partners personality, style, strengths and weakness.




Let's Assess our Current Skills...

Here's How Your Meetings will work:

- 1. President will call meeting to order.
- 2. Pledge
- 3. Review minutes of previous meeting
- 4. President Introduces Coordinator
- 5. Coordinator discusses current learning objective & assignment/activities.
- 6. Table Topics
- 7. Introduce Speaker and Timing Requirements
- 8. Introduce Evaluators
- 9. Introduce Next Learning Objective
- 10. Explain Assignment and Announce Next Week's Speakers.
